

ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA

FOR ACADEMIC, CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP AWARDS

Faith Baptist Christian School desires to recognize and honour the character, academic, and leadership attributes of our student body. Following is the criteria for selecting recipients at the Annual Awards Night which is held at the conclusion of the school year.

CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP AWARDS

SCHOOL SPIRIT AWARD

Awarded to one student from each learning centre who diligently strives to uphold the principles, standards, and godly culture of the school throughout the year. These students demonstrate a positive attitude toward all areas of school life and encourage others to do the same. Students will also receive a **Gladstone Regional Council Bursary** as part of their award.

TEACHER'S AWARD

Awarded to one student from each learning centre who, in the teacher's judgment, has applied themselves in all functions of the classroom, with emphasis on the quality of their application to academic work.

MOST IMPROVED STUDENT AWARD

This award recognizes a student who has shown a strong commitment to self-improvement. This may involve results, learning skills, interpersonal skills, behaviour, or resolving other impediments to their success.

CHRISTIAN CHARACTER AWARD

Awarded to any student who has consistently demonstrated a strong level of Christian character in attitude and practice.

SCRIPTURE MEMORIZATION AWARD

Awarded to any student who has memorized all required Scripture passages throughout the year.

ACADEMIC & ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

SCHOLASTIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Awarded to one student from each learning centre who has attained a very high standard of achievement across all learning areas.

LITERACY AWARD

Awarded to any student who has demonstrated excellent outcomes in all aspects of literacy (listening, viewing, reading, speaking, writing and creating). The student maintains this standard across all learning areas.

NUMERACY AWARD

Awarded to any student who has demonstrated excellent outcomes in all aspects of numeracy (number and algebra, measurement and geometry, statistics and probability). The student maintains this standard across all learning areas.

SCIENCE/STEM AWARD

Awarded to a primary and secondary student who has demonstrated excellent outcomes through participation in curricular and extra-curricular activities in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

SPORTS AWARD

Awarded to a primary and secondary student who has demonstrated capability in a variety of sporting activities. These students will participate in all school sporting activities and perform to the best of their ability. They will demonstrate good sportsmanship by encouraging other students and by always playing fair.

VISUAL/MEDIA ARTS AWARD

Awarded to a primary and secondary student who has demonstrated excellent outcomes in a variety of art activities and demonstrating Christian character with diligent completion of projects.

PERFORMING ARTS AWARD

Awarded to a primary and secondary student who has demonstrated excellence in music performance, outstanding vocal capability, and outstanding overall stage presentation through participation in curricular and extra-curricular activities (music workshops, Eisteddfod, Student Convention, etc). Students also demonstrated a commitment to continual improvement in their musical and drama performances and presentations.

VET STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARD

Vocational Education and Training in Schools is delivery of nationally recognized qualifications to school students, providing them with skills and knowledge required for employment in specific industries. This award acknowledges and celebrates the achievements of a senior high student who uses vocational education and training to further their careers.

AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARD

Awarded to two students (one in Yr 10, one in Yr 12) who demonstrate leadership and teamwork within both the school and the broader community and who display strong values, such as doing one's best, showing proper respect for others, and "mateship", all of which are integral to Australian society. The recipients will receive a certificate and monetary award.

GLADSTONE PORTS CORPORATION BURSARY

Gladstone Ports Corporation implements a bursary program throughout high schools within Gladstone and surrounding districts. The Bursary is awarded to a Year 12 student for excellence in demonstrating a positive attitude within peer and staff relationships, demonstrates a genuine academic commitment to their studies and demonstrates a regular and willing connection to community.

Awarded to a student for outstanding or exceptional commitment to school music program and/or community music activities, who displays enthusiasm and consistency to their musical education, regardless of musical ability and demonstrates commitment to furthering their musical skills
